



# FORTALEZA, BRAZIL: THE PARADOX WHEREBY GIVING IS RECEIVING

On the force-free principle of fusion power

While the British Empire crowd of Wall Street and London is getting ready to put humanity under a brown thermonuclear cloud as early as the month of August, for the purpose of reducing the world population from seven billion people to less than one billion, the rest of the world is presently looking for the leadership of the [BRICS](#) nations to apply to themselves the one principle that is capable of stopping this insane British drive to World War III. That principle is the force-free principle of fusion power, the power of the principle of the benefit of the other of the [1648 Peace of Westphalia](#). In the Asian civilization, the same principle is exemplified by the ancient Chinese principle of generosity of the [Jade Rabbit](#).

My purpose, in writing this short report, is to identify some of the epistemological boundary conditions whereby the force-free principle of giving without expecting anything in return is the best anti-war principle behind what Lyndon LaRouche has identified as a New Just Word Economic Order. This is the principle that was underlying the talks of the [BRICS](#) Summit in Fortaleza Brazil during their recent extraordinary summit meeting of June 15 and 16, 2014, in Fortaleza, Brazil.

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## WHAT IS A FORCE-FREE LEAST ACTION PRINCIPLE?

Think of the mental process exerted at the [BRICS](#) meeting as a fusion process which will unite the world in a completely new and just economic system of proportionality between all of the nations of the world, such that the new system will no longer be centered on any dominating nation or system and will have no fixed circumference. The idea you want to develop is the Nicholas of Cusa idea of the coincidence of the opposites whereby *the more you increase your power to give, the more you will have increased your power to receive; for “he who gives most shall receive most.”* This is the least-action principle of fusion power. The irony of this [Leibnizian principle of felicity](#) is that the world will no longer be centered on increasing one’s power to steal from others, but vectored on the “pursuit of happiness.”

Take the case of the two opposites before us today: war and peace. Imagine yourself having to generate a new paradigm of relationships among the nations of the world whereby only such relationships are given as centers of their arrangements. What you have is a universe whose center of the whole is never the same and is always the opposite to the self-centered interest of the parts. In other words, in order for a Just New World Economic Order to be established based on peace and development, you have to risk going to World War III. This is the paradoxical situation the world is in right now.

However, the irony of such an emerging new paradigm, which has been adopted by Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa at the [BRICS](#) summit in Fortaleza Brazil, is an American principle which cannot be realized without the United States, because the very principle of centering the world on a center that doesn't exist is to push it to the point it cannot go any further, and that is the role of the American System as opposed to the British Empire System. In other words, President Barak Obama must be impeached and America must adopt the [LaRouche Four Point Recovery Plan](#). This is the reason why the United States of America has never come so close to either launch the thermonuclear extinction of mankind, or discover the principle of thermonuclear fusion to be shared with every other nation in the world.

Therefore, the time has come where the power to destroy the human species is finally being opposed by a greater power to give without expectation of receiving anything in return; that is, a power inclusively based on the happiness of others. As Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi stated: "For the first time, it [ the BRICS] brings together a group of nations on the parameter of 'future potential'; rather than existing prosperity or shared identities." Thus, the American Constitutional Principle of the "Pursuit of Happiness" for all of the peoples of the world has now been revived as the principle of the future which opens the new Age of Fusion for our Solar System. Once such a principle has been established, can its implementation be far behind?

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
